MUNICIPALITY OF GUIGUINTO

The name “Guiguinto” literally translates to “Gold”. The early conquistadores went to this town on a harvest season when it lusher in golden rice stalks against the sun. Through the pages of history, Guiguinto gave justice to its name for it proved to be of great political worth, abounding in agricultural riches and of its strategic import since the times of the Encomienda in the 1590’s.

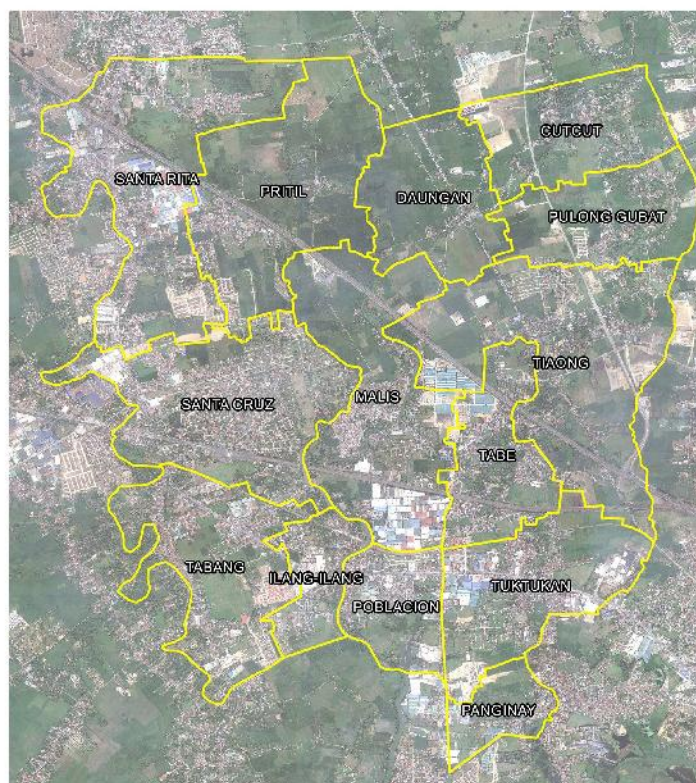
In 1951, the Municipality of Guiguinto was one of the territorial classification of the Spaniards known as the “Encomienda” referring to the parcelization of land for taxation purposes.

Known by its ancient name “Ma-yi”, the Province of Bulacan is believed to have been settled long before the Spanish Explorer came to the Philippines. These settlements were organized by the Spaniards into early towns called “Pueblos”, including the town of Guiguinto, which was founded in 1641.

In 1903, the 25 municipalities of Bulacan were reduced to 13. With this consolidation, Guiguinto became part of the Municipality of Bulacan. Since then, several other divisions and modifications have been done on the territorial boundaries of the towns in the Province of Bulacan.

However, on 24 December 1914, Governor General Francis Burton Harrison issued Order Ejecutiva No. 126 (Executive Order No. 126) separating Guiguinto from the Municipality of Bulacan, Bulacan.

Hence, on January 1, 1915 Guiguinto started to be recognized as an independent municipality with Antonio Figueroa as its first “Municipal President”. The town’s population was then about 4,000.

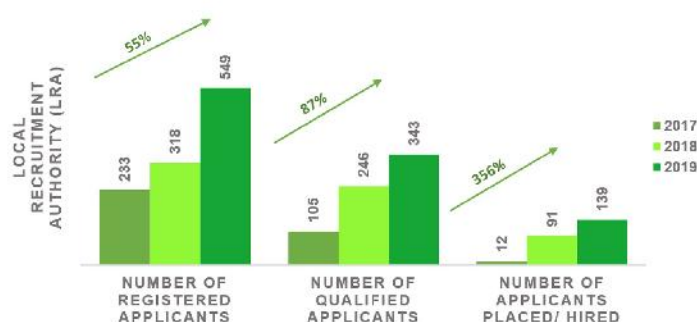
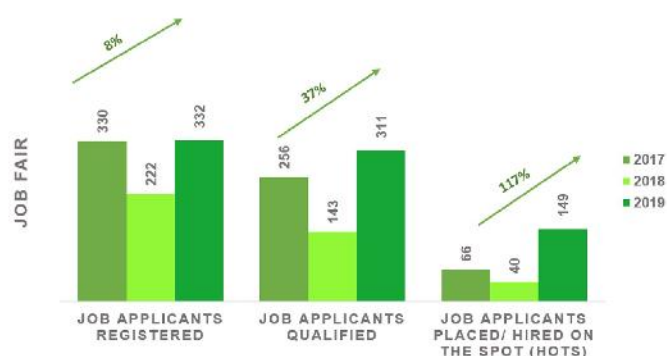
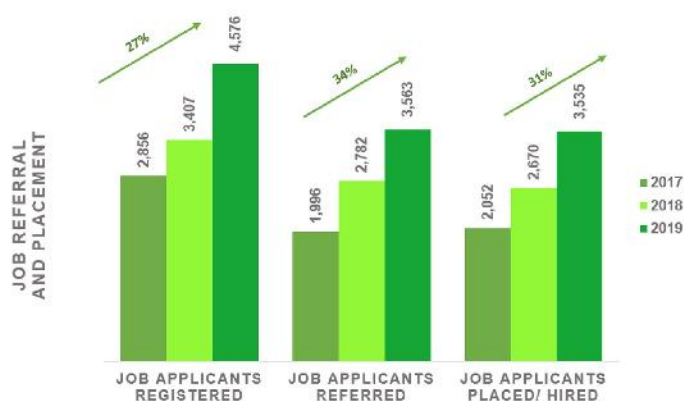


KABUHAYAN

One of the top priorities of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto is to empower every Guiguineño through the provision of training skills, knowledge, access to decent livelihood opportunities, and development of local enterprises designed to improve productivity and income. The Municipal Government of Guiguinto is also in full support to achieve sustainable agriculture and horticulture in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Employment facilitation strategies were conducted to address the unemployment and improve the standard of living of every Guiguineño. Numerous job seekers; unemployed, skilled and unskilled workers, fresh graduates from college, universities and other training institutions, displaced workers, and employees seeking advancement benefited from the program. About 14,252 job vacancies were solicited.

Pre-Employment Orientation Seminar



Through the Pre-Employment Orientation Seminar (PEOS), graduating college students and other job applicants were given training on resume writing and handling job interviews.

Labor Education for Graduating Students



Graduating students of vocational and baccalaureate courses which would sooner or later join the labor force were given orientation on employment facilitation, worker's protection, and social security coverage for employees through the Labor Education for Graduating Students (LEGS).

Anti-Illegal Recruitment Seminar



In partnership with the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA), seminar on anti-illegal recruitment activities was conducted.

Entrepreneurship Seminar and Bookkeeping



Basic knowledge on entrepreneurship and bookkeeping were conducted through the help of Department of Labor and Employment.

Career Guidance Orientation Seminar



Under the K-12 Curriculum, junior high school students will have to choose from four tracks; Academic, Technical-Vocational-Livelihood, Sports, and Arts and Design. The Career Guidance Orientation Seminar (CGOS) helps the students to decide for their career choices considering the labor market needs. About 32 sessions were conducted in three public high schools in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS

The Special Program for the Employment of Students (SPES) is mandated by the Republic Act No. 7323 otherwise known as "An Act To Help Poor But Deserving Students Pursue Their Education by Encouraging Their Employment During Summer and/or Christmas Vacations, Through Incentives Granted to Employers, Allowing Them to Pay Only Sixty Per Centum of Their Salaries or Wages and the Forty Per Centum Through Education Vouchers to be Paid by the Government, Prohibiting and Penalizing the Filing of Fraudulent and Fictitious Claims, and for Other Purposes."



GOVERNMENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

About three to six months of internship opportunity was given to 43 Guiguinterños. The program aims to create competitive and skilled workforce in the fields of public service.

TULONG PANGHANAPBUHAY SA ATING DISADVANTAGED/ DISPLACED WORKERS

Community-based emergency employment assistance was provided to 257 displaced, underemployed, and seasonal workers for a minimum period of 10 but not exceeding 30 working days depending on the nature of work given.

WORKER'S HIRING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

46 Guiguinterños have benefited in pursuance to Republic Act No. 6685 which requires construction companies, including the Department of Public Works and Highways and contractors for government-funded infrastructure projects to hire 30 percent of skilled and 50 percent of unskilled labor requirements from the areas where the project is constructed/ located.

With the successful establishment of Skills Training Center in the Municipality of Guiguinto, 144 Guiguinterños benefited from the following training courses since it was established in 2018.

SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD OPPORTUNITIES

DOLE Kabuhayan Starter Kits Project

In partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the informal sectors, groups with special needs, and displaced workers were provided with livelihood starter kits inclusive of package of services that will enable them to engage in sustainable self-employment.

Puhunan ni Boy Loan

To provide additional capital and assist small-scale entrepreneurs in the Municipality of Guiguinto, the current Administration launched the Puhunan ni Boy (PNB) Loan program. For the past three years, 1,807 beneficiaries of PNB Loan were given a total of PhP9,035,000.00.

OWWA DESK SERVICES

Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) is working closely with DOLE and PESO to ensure the protection and well-being of the Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW). In 2019, 84 OFWs and OFW dependents were assisted wherein 14 were given welfare assistance, six were given bereavement assistance, two were granted Education for Development Scholarship, two benefited from OFW Dependents Scholarship Program, and 30 were granted CHED Scholarship.

PESO EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Under the National Skills Registration Program of DOLE, profile of job seekers and job vacancies from different registered employers were recorded in the PESO Employment Information System (PEIS). The registry is maintained and updated by Public Employment Services Office nationwide.

AGRICULTURE

The Municipality of Guiguinto is adapting strategies to implement initiatives in setting the standard for sustainable farming practices in Guiguinto.

HORTICULTURE

Efforts to continuously promote the booming horticulture industry in the Municipality of Guiguinto were conducted through Municipal Agriculture Office and Garden City Multi-Purpose Cooperative. The 5-Year Garden Industry Development Roadmap is continuously being improved along with the revitalization of the Garden City in Tabang-Sta. Cruz Cloverleaf of Guiguinto.

COOPERATIVE

In order to strengthen different cooperatives and enliven Damayang Filipino at Kooperatibismo, Kulturang Bulakenyo Tungo sa Progreso of Department of Agriculture, Municipal Cooperative Development Council conducted Coop Parade and Cooplympics wherein 18 cooperatives with 200 cooperative members participated. In addition, outreach and feeding programs with 13 cooperatives at Tahanang Mapagkalinga ni Mother Rita, Rosaryville, Sta. Cruz, Guiguinto, Bulacan were conducted.



KATAHIMIKAN AT KAAYUSAN

There are continuous efforts for intensifying the campaign on the fight against illegal drugs, criminality, corruption, violence, and establishing a peaceful environment for Guiguinteños. The Municipal Government and Guiguinto PNP work hand in hand to keep Guiguinto as one of the safest town in the Philippines. Crime statistics have continually been improving showing the effectiveness of the Municipal Peace & Order and Public safety Programs.

In 2019, the Municipality of Guiguinto was rated 93.14% in the Peace and Order Council and 88% in the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council Audit by the DILG. Resulting to:

INTENSIFIED POLICE VISIBILITY

More checkpoints have been scheduled throughout the Municipality especially during the night. Police officers were also placed on beat patrols to ensure public security and thwart any possible crimes that may arise within the Municipality.

ALL-OUT WAR AGAINST ILLEGAL DRUGS

As of December 2019, a total of 929 drug personalities have surrendered to Guiguinto MPS since the all-out war against illegal drugs was launched in July 2016.

OPLAN RODY

To preempt the possible occurrence of crimes, Guiguinto MPS continuously conducts OPLAN RODY to rid out the street drunkards and minors violating the curfew. A total of 6,845 individuals were given stern warning.

OPLAN KATOK

To reduce the use of loose or unlicensed firearms which have been frequent instrument of crimes, Guiguinto MPS strengthened its Firearm Control Program through Oplan Katok to firearm holders with expired firearm license. About 435 firearm holders were visited and 26 illegal firearms were surrendered in Guiguinto Police Station for safekeeping.

OPLAN TAMBULI

To prevent and control occurrence of crimes, Guiginto MPS continuously conduct information drive wherein leaflets/pamphlets containing crime awareness and modus operandi of criminals were being distributed to the community.

FAMILY, JUVENILE AND GENDER AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

To promote active relationship with the community in line with the implementation of Family, Juvenile and Gender and Development Program, Guiginto MPS conducted seminars with members of the youth sector.

UGNAYAN-DALAW SA BARANGAY

Elements of Guiginto MPS visited 14 Barangays wherein dialogues with barangay officials were conducted for peace and order status and concerns. The activity includes information dissemination regarding important talking points in implementing pertinent laws and regulations, IEC materials distribution, and strengthening camaraderie between police officers and local government unit.

PULIS NIYO PO SA BARANGAY PROGRAM

The program facilitated quick respond to an emergency call or situation with the benefit of having a designated police officer in every barangay.

PA-SINE SA BARANGAY

In order to attract the community, free film showing was led by the Guiginto MPS once a year in different barangays in Guiginto. Pa-Sine sa Barangay focused on the camaraderie between the PNP and the Local Government Unit in implementing Anti-drug abuse campaign.

PISO KO, PARA SA KAPWA KO

The “Piso Ko, para sa Kapwa Ko” program encouraged everyone to donate a minimum of one peso. Amount collected were remitted to higher headquarters and were then used to buy the necessities for the chosen less fortunate beneficiaries.

HEPE KO, TITSER KO

Visitation and lectures on different schools were conducted to increase public awareness particularly in the youth sector on the ill effects of drug abuse and dependency.

BOLA KAYSA DROGA

Guiginto MPS hosted a basketball game to divert the attention of youth sector into sports, self-discipline, and team work instead of possible involvement to illegal drugs.

PROJECT CALL-TEXT BRIGADE

Additional way to immediately report crimes, incidents, and other vital information to the police was launched by disseminating contact information of Guiginto MPS to the public.

SAMA-SAMANG SIKAD AT SAMA-SAMANG TAKBO SA BARANGAY

Guiginto MPS participated in different biking events to build rapport with the community. Police officers believe that working together with various socio-civic groups and organizations is more effective in maintaining peace and order in the community.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Information drive and dialogue with different barangays, schools, NGOS, CVOs, and other socio-civic organizations were conducted to raise public awareness on common modus operandi of criminals, safety tips, and other various PNP campaign to help maintain low crime rate.

BARANGAY PEACE-KEEPING ACTION TEAM

Guiguinto MPS continuously thrive to keep Peace and Order within the Municipality with the help of Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT) and other force-multipliers. In addition, Guiguinto MPS has institutionalized the Barangay Peacekeeping Operation and maintains good working relationship with other force multipliers to ensure peace and order at all times.

OPLAN LIGTAS NA PAMAYANAN

Oplan Ligtas na Pamayanan is the BFP's response to the ever-growing demand for a more adaptive, comprehensive, and immersive fire protection program for the communities, rural and urban villages, and barangays. It sums up the agency's new and improved approach of providing a fire protection plan that will truly produce results.

FIRE AND EARTHQUAKE DRILL

Lectures, demonstrations, and drills for earthquake occurrence and fire prevention were conducted by the Guiguinto BFP in coordination with MDRRMO. Barangays, schools, establishments, Community Fire Auxiliary Group, and other volunteers participated in the event.

OPLAN PAGHALASA

Oplan Paghahanda Laban sa Sakuna (PAGHALASA) is the BFP's contingency plan that has been activated nationwide. In coordination with the MDRRMO and Municipal Engineering Office, inspection to public buildings, schools, and business establishments were conducted.

SECURITY BOMB THREAT ASSESSMENT

If possible, a threat assessment team shall:

1. Communicate
2. Assess the legitimacy of the threat, and
3. Determine the course of action.

When concerns for safety exists, **police** shall be notified and requested to attend, manage the incident and investigate.

At school, if through its security staff, direct the evacuation of any building area or part thereof and/or request a search of the area be conducted by suitably trained.

EVACUATION

Be prepared to evacuate – await further instruction from the proper authorities.

Evacuate the building as instructed to do so by the person in authority.

If possible, everyone should be requested to remove all their personal belongings, e.g. briefcases, purse/wallet, keys etc., when evacuating.

IN EVACUATION AREA

Head count each section and report to the Team Leader.

Listen for the announcement of the proper authorities that the area is already clear and safe.

IF AN OBJECT IS FOUND

1. Handle with care, do not shake or bump.
2. Isolate and look for indicators.
3. Do not touch, open, or smell the suspected package.
4. Keep the area clear.
5. Treat it as a suspected or suspicious package. Call 911 or the police.

IF THREAT IS BY LETTER

1. Call the authorities from a campus phone or from a cellphone or off-campus phone.
2. Handle the note as little as possible.

SUGOD GUIGUINTO COMMAND CENTER

24/7 fiber optic-powered command center was established committed in monitoring peace and order and public safety in the Municipality of Guiguinto. About 86 cameras in 32 strategic locations transmit live video feeds to Command Center.

KALINISAN AT KAPALIGIRAN

The attainment of clean and safe environment has been evident through the Kalinisan Programs as part of the 7K Development Goals of the Municipality of Guiguinto.

The Municipality of Guiguinto was recognized by national and provincial environment offices as Local Government Unit with Best Practices and Exceptional Contribution in Environmental Management and Preservation, being one of the 30 Most Outstanding Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Offices in the Philippines, Environmental Compliance Audit Passer, implementation of Ecological Solid Waste Management.

MANILA BAY CLEAN-UP, REHABILITATION AND PRESERVATION PROGRAM

In compliance with the Supreme Court Writ of Continuing Mandamus on the clean-up of Manila Bay, regular clean-up activities every Saturday were conducted by municipal employees, barangays, volunteers, and other organizations. The Municipality of Guiguinto was rated 88.30% in the LGU Compliance Audit for MBCURPP in 2019.

34TH INTERNATIONAL COASTAL CLEAN-UP DAY

Ocean Conservancy's International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) is the world's largest volunteer effort for ocean's health. Held every third Saturday of September every year, thousands and thousands of volunteers from around the globe including Municipality of Guiguinto participated in clearing tons of trash from coastlines, rivers and lakes and recorded every piece of trash collected.

CLEAN-UP ACTIVITIES

Aside from maintaining the cleanliness of waterways in the Municipality, regular clean-up activities in public places were spearheaded by eco-boys and eco-volunteers. Cleanliness of plastic and concrete barriers along Mac Arthur Highway, Municipal Arena and Botanical Centrum, and parking areas were strictly monitored and maintained. These activities were also for the Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation.

BANTAY KALIKASAN TASK FORCE

About 285 individuals were issued citations by the Bantay Kalikasan Task Force for violating environmental regulations in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Apprehended individuals were given two options; Community service or a minimum administrative fine of PhP1,000.00.

GARBAGE COLLECTION

Additional 2 to the existing 5 garbage trucks were acquired by the Municipality of Guiguinto. It will help 151 eco-volunteers and 162 eco-tribikes in garbage collection.

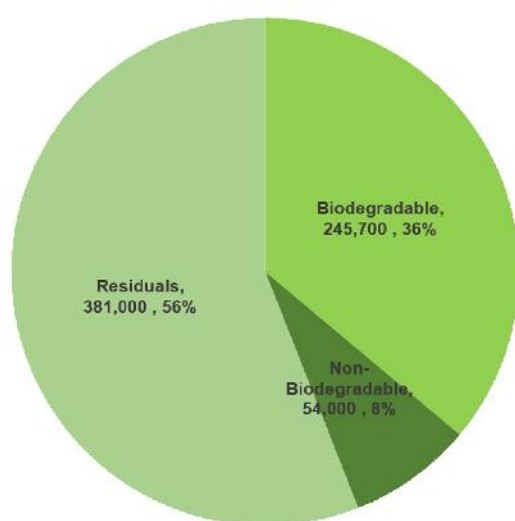
MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (MRF)

To ensure proper sanitation, there is a regular weekly inspection at four Material Recovery Facility (MRF) in barangays Ilang-Ilang, Malis, Tiaong, and Tuktukan.

In 2019, a total of 381,000 MT of waste were collected in the Municipality of Guiguinto; 245,700 MT of biodegradable wastes, 54,000 MT of non-biodegradable, and 381,000 MT of residual wastes.

INSPECTION OF ESTABLISHMENTS

Establishments in Municipality of Guiguinto are regularly inspected by MENRO to ensure compliance to different environmental regulation. In addition, air and water sampling were conducted in Sunworld Industrial Group Corporation in coordination with DENR Region III, PENRO, and CENRO.

GUINTONG LIKHA

With the “Basura Mo, Pangkabuhayan Ko” tagline of Guintong Likha, handicrafts made out of recyclable materials were created and showcased in different local Environment Summit. About 97 kilograms of single-used plastics were donated by various private companies and barangays to be used for recycled bags.

ECO-BRICKS

Public Elementary Schools in Guiguinto actively participated in reduce, reuse, recycle project for environment. A total of 4,807 pet bottles filled with plastic sachets equivalent to 8,134.59 kilograms of single-used plastics were collected from schools.

TREE PLANTING PROJECT

Guiguinto Lions Club District 301-D1 successfully coordinated with the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources and Municipal Agriculture Office on the tree planting conducted at Daungan Model Farm.

EARTH HOUR 2019

Going beyond an hour of switching lights off and making a habit of adapting other environment friendly measures to contribute awareness in climate change in biodiversity was raised in celebration of Earth Hour 2019, “Our Home, Our Future”.

ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION EDUCATION CAMPAIGN

Various business establishments, public and private schools, and different environment development partners benefited from the environmental information education campaign.

E-WASTE MANAGEMENT

A memorandum of Agreement among the Municipality of Guiguinto, DENR through the EMB-Region III (DENR-EMB R3), and Environmental Practitioners Association (EPA) entitled Recyclables Collection Events (RCEs) and Collection/Disposal of Selected Hazardous Wastes was held last July 15, 2019 at GMACC, Guiguinto, Bulacan.

In line with this, the First Recyclables Collection Event of Hazardous Waste/E-Waste was launched last September 18, 2019. About 1,500 liters of used crude oil, 2,664 electronic wastes, and 2,746 bulbs and lead-acid batteries were recycled.



MGA KWENTO NI LOLO BOY

MENRO in coordination with Youth for Environment in Schools Organization (YES-O) Officers launched “Mga Kento ni Lolo Boy” which aims to raise awareness on proper Solid Waste Management in Public Elementary Schools through role-playing activities.



WAR AGAINST WASTE

WAW, BASURA BUSTERS!

A search for the best youth initiated War Against Waste (WAW) is a joint environmental project of MENRO and Public Information Arts & Recreation Office (PIARO) in coordination with Municipal Youth Development Council, Department of Education, Association of Barangay Captains, and Sangguniang Kabataan Federation of Guiguinto.

This innovative project aims to achieve safe and healthy environment, raise environmental awareness, promote environmental protection and conservation, and impart the value of volunteerism and community spirit of bayanihan in the Municipality of Guiguinto.



I-REFILL – REFILL REVOLUTION

With the success of first ever refill revolution launched by the Municipality of Guiguinto, the second i-Refill – Refill Revolution was held in partnership with Shoyu Food Corporations, Hahsy Industries Inc., and Glochem Marketing & Recycling Corporation. An estimate of 16 tons would have been plastic wastes were prevented.

In December 2019, i-Refill – Refill Revolution was also launched in 14 Barangays of Guiguinto. Condiments such as soy sauce and vinegar, detergent powder, dishwashing liquid, fabric conditioner, and bath soap can be purchased in lower prices by providing clean empty containers.





KALUSUGAN

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto is looking forward to a paradigm shift in the health care system where people visit hospitals and health centers not because they are sick but to improve their health and lifestyles. Plans are being developed to formulate system focusing on providing primary health care for every Guiguinteño.

HEALTH FACILITIES

Rural Health Units in Barangay Poblacion (RHU 1) and Barangay Tiaong (RHU 2) together with 12 Barangay Health Stations are equipped to provide utmost quality health services for everyone.

TB DOTS CERTIFIED FACILITY

Free consultation, sputum test, and treatment are accessible in TB DOTS Certified Facility in RHU II Tiaong. About 307 confirmed Tuberculosis cases were registered and have been given treatments.

ANIMAL BITE CENTER

Anti-Rabies Awareness Seminar is regularly conducted in all barangays in Guiguinto. About 3,414 dogs and 163 cats were vaccinated. Stray dogs and cats are still prohibited to protect both the animals and the community.



GUINTONG KANLUNGAN

In response to the increasing number of HIV cases, Satellite Treatment Hub is continuously providing HIV testing services, anti-Retroviral therapy, post exposure prophylaxis, and other HIV/STI diagnosis and treatment. In 2019, 1,013 patients were screened and counselled, while 26 patients were given treatment.

AGAP BUHAY COMMUNITY

Blood Letting Program in coordination with the Philippine Red Cross was conducted wherein 376 individuals donated blood.



DENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

Dental examination, tooth extraction, Oral Prophylaxis, tooth fillings, oral health education and visitations to public schools are regularly conducted. Basic Oral Health Care were provided to 13,476 Guiguinteños.

ANG BARANGAY CIRCUMCISION

In 2019, 839 brave youngsters from 14 barangays have undergone free circumcision organized by the Rural Health Units.

GINTONG AKSYON LABAN SA ALTAPRESYON

In coordination with Our Lady of Fatima University and St. Jude College Phinma, around 80 Guiguinteños benefitted from the high blood pressure/hypertension awareness campaign conducted in Barangay Tiaong.

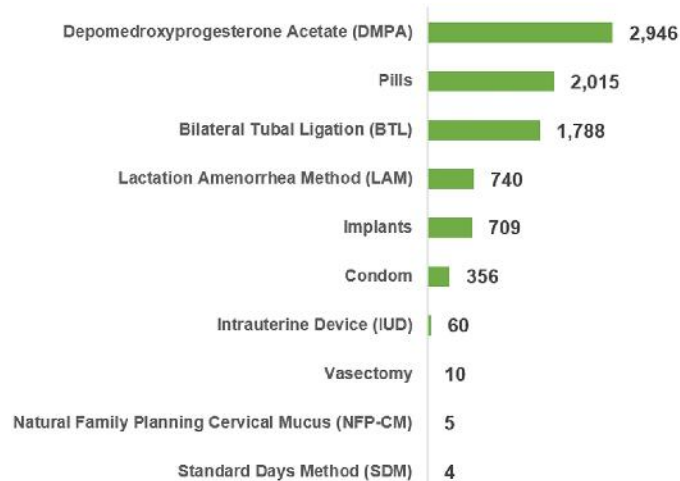
MATERNAL AND CHILD CARE

About 100 percent of 1,613 pregnant women in the Municipality of Guiguinto were given pre-natal checkup every trimester during their pregnancy. They were also provided with post-partum health including assessment of physical, social, and psychological well-being of the mother. On the other hand, 1,735 children below one year old are fully immunized in 2019.

Various activities were also conducted to raise awareness on different health issues.

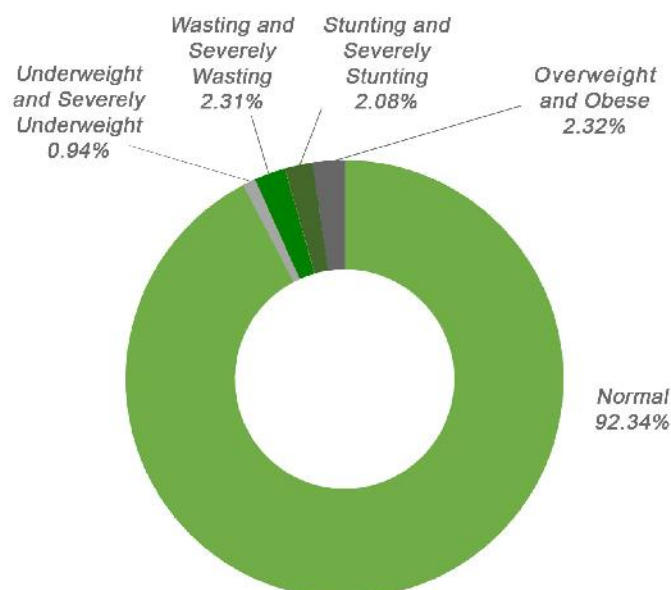

NUTRITIONAL STATUS

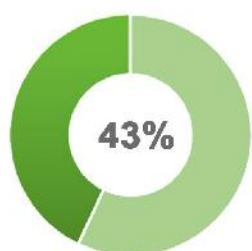

However, the prevalence of underweight and severely underweight, wasting and severely wasting, stunted and severely stunted, and overweight and obese was 0.94 percent, 2.31 percent, 2.08 percent, and 2.32 percent respectively.



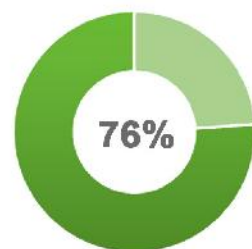
With strict monitoring and continuous conduct of supplementary and complementary feeding, 68.93 percent of these children have successfully improved nutritional status.



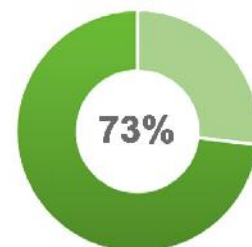

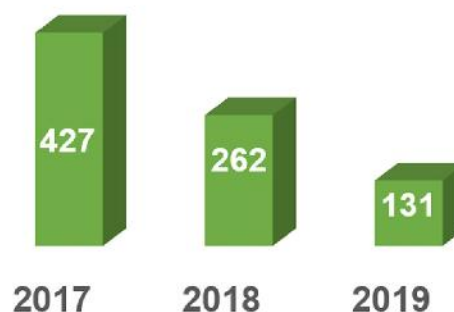

NUTRITION MONTH

Pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 491 Nutrition Act of the Philippines, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto celebrated the Nutrition month with the theme, “Kumain nang wasto at maging aktibo, push natin ‘to” (Eat Healthy and do physical activity...let’s push this!). Activities are conducted such as Symposium on Good Eating, Exercising Habits and Micronutrient Supplementation, Mutya ng Buntis, Nutri-Poem, Nutri-Jingle writing, logo making contest, School Canteen Monitoring and Evaluation Contest for Healthiest School Canteen.

TEENAGE PREGNANCY

An average annual decrease of 44 percent in prevalence of teenage pregnancy serves as proof of effective programs of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto in addressing the issue.



PERSONS WITH DISABILITY (PWDs)

Better facilitation of benefits intended for the 1,786 persons with disability are formulated. In 2019, livelihood training, active participation on national PWDs program, and hosting of Philippine Sports Association for the Differently Abled are conducted.

SENIOR CITIZENS

About 9,000 senior citizens are benefiting from programs by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto that aims to recognize the contribution of the elderly citizen in the nation building.

OSPITAL NG GUIGUINTO (ONG)

In 2019, the newly renovated ONG admitted 2,530 patients, attended 25,469 outpatients, and served 10,367 emergency cases. It is equivalent to 118.61 percent occupancy rate given the 25-bed capacity of the hospital. Patient care benefits, maternal package, and new born screening are also available in ONG.



KARUNUNGAN

Inclusive, equitable, and quality education is guaranteed for every Guiguinteño. Effective learning environments, competent educators, scholarships, and equal educational opportunities are provided to ensure lifelong learning for students.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto has established 24 Child Development Centers (CDC) in accordance with Republic Act 6972 wherein every barangay must have CDC. The 24 CDCs and 24 Child Development Workers (CDW) are accredited by the Early Childhood Care and Development Council and Department of the Social Welfare and Development. In addition, there are 20 Child Development Aides supporting CDCs with high number of learners.

Strategies and efforts on the **Recruitment and Early Learner's Registration** including annual house to house visits have kept the number of attending three to four year old children consistently high. There efforts by the Child Development Workers and Child Development Aides have all contributed to the Municipal Government's recognition as a Child Friendly Local Government the 1,899 children in 2019 have all attended Child Development Program without imposing payments to their parents and guardian indigents.

Parent Enhancement Sessions (PES) are also conducted to ensure involvement of parents and application of learnings gained from CDCs are sustained at home. About 96 sessions are conducted through the help of Municipal Population Office, Municipal Nutrition Office, and Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office.

Municipal Children's Congress is held in accordance with Republic Act 10661 declaring November as the National Children's Month to commemorate the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child by the United Nations General Assembly.

Family Day Celebration participated by 1,972 families of Child Development Learners (CDLs) is successfully conducted through Proclamation 847 Series of 1996 declaring every fourth Sunday of September as Family Thanksgiving Day to focus on the importance of strengthening and promoting unity, solidarity and stability of the Filipino family as the basic unit of Filipino society and for whose well-being all national development efforts are directed.

Unang Hakbang/Moving-Up Ceremony for the school year 2019-2020 was attended by 1,426 CDLs that graduated from the National Early Learning Curriculum. CDLs will be endorsed and transferred to the K-12 program of the Department of Education.

Provision of School Supplies for the CDLs are conducted annually to motivate them. About 4,000 learning material kits were distributed.



ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

For the School Year 2019-2020, elementary schools in Guiguinto were able to meet the standard ratio of one teacher for every 35 students. However, there is still a need to improve facilities and provide additional 69 classrooms to meet the standard ratio of one classroom for every 35 students. In line with that, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto is continuously addressing the problem with the help of different development partners. Aside from that, a decrease of 2.65% in the 2016 to 2019 completion rate of elementary students was recorded.

On the other hand, 4,181 students graduated from elementary, 1,455 books were distributed, around PHP11 Million learning materials like computer set were given, additional school buildings were constructed, and around PHP600 thousand incentives and allowance for students and teachers were granted.

SECONDARY EDUCATION

Four public secondary schools are operating in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Felizardo C. Lipana National High School, Guiguinto National Vocational High School main and annex campus, and Tiaong National High School are all offering Junior High School Curriculum and special Senior High School program. Public secondary schools were able to meet the standard ratio of one teacher for every 35 students.

TERTIARY EDUCATION

Training Centers such as Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) in Tabang, ATEC Technological College in Sta. Rita, Global Alliance Technological Institute Corp. in Sta. Cruz, and SAGE Asian Language and Education Center Bulacan Inc. in Sta. Cruz are still offering different training, technical, and vocational programs. On the other hand, Immaculate Concepcion Major Seminary in Tabe serves as a private institution that offers tertiary education.

SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EDUCATION

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto ensures availability of education opportunities for students with special educational needs and for those seeking other options to the existing formal education.

In 2019, Special Science Elementary School (SSES) is still offered in Guiguinto with 626 enrollees. The total 478 ALS enrollees are managed by the teachers while the total 132 SPES enrollees are guided by five SPED teachers.

GNVHS offers free skills training for interested Guiguinteros. In 2019, Beauty Care, Shielded Metal Arch Welding, and Electric Installation Maintenance were offered.

An average annual increase of 14% for the past three years were recorded in the list of scholars of Municipal Government of Guiguinto. Financial assistance to deserving Guiguinteros college students are being provided every semester. In 2019, PhP2.8 Million were allotted for first semester Scholarship Program granting a total of 835 students from different colleges and universities.

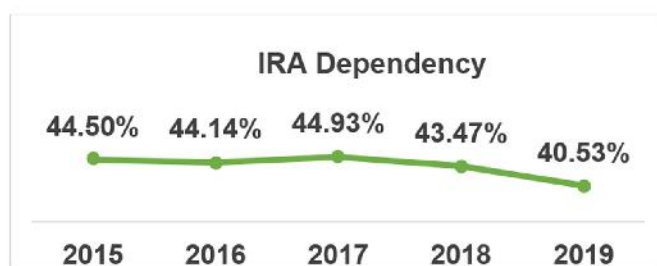


KAUNLARAN

Improved financial position, increased local revenues, enhanced economic prosperity, and well-maintained comfort and convenience through infrastructure development are being executed by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto with the help of every Guiguinteño.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

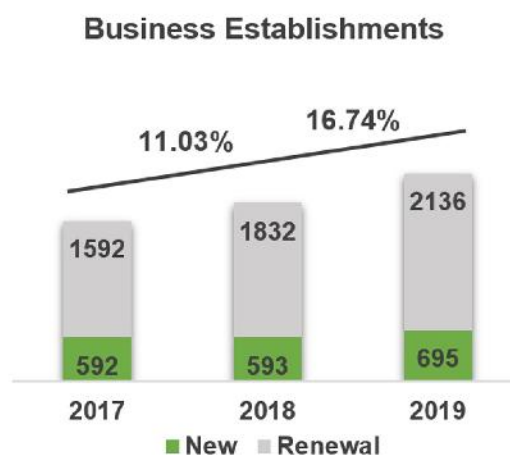
An average annual increase of 17 percent equivalent to PhP69 Million were collected from actual local sources in the past five years. The increase in actual collection stabilizes the Internal Revenue (IRA) Dependency with average annual decrease of 2.26 percent for the past five years.

BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS

In 2019, 2,831 business establishments were registered with 695 new applications and 2,136 renewal of permits resulting to additional 2,692 jobs generated. About 13.89 percent annual average increase in the number of business registrations for the past three years were recorded. This resulted to an income from business tax of PhP103,380,920.00, PhP124,249,320.41, and PhP192,444,505.01 for the year 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.



BUSINESS ONE STOP SHOP

In compliance with Republic Act 11032 or the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018, Business One Stop Shop (BOSS) was established and implemented in the Municipality of Guiguinto. It aims to streamline the current procedures in government services. In 2019, issuance of barangay permits, clearances, and other barangay level documents were incorporated which resulted to more effective and efficient business registration.

JOINT INSPECTION TEAM

With the establishment of Joint Inspection Team (JIT), tax campaign and regular inspection of all establishments are conducted to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. About 2,831 establishments were inspected in 2019.

KAPIHAN WITH MAYOR

The annual event for business establishments and awarding of top businesses in the Municipality of Guiguinto was successfully conducted in the past six years. Various taxpayers participated in the event. About 57 percent of business tax collected in Municipal Government of Guiguinto is from the top 100 taxpayers.

GUIGUINTO TRADE FAIR

Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) in Guiguinto are recognized as substantial contributors to the local economic development. Their innovations initiatives serve as drivers of income and employment generation. In 2019, about 60 MSME business owners participated in Guiguinto Trade Fair and were given opportunities to showcase their products.

MUNICIPAL HOUSING PROJECT

For the past 15 years, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto is committed in providing an affordable and decent shelter safe from calamities. Existing local housing projects were regularly monitored and revisited. Through the Municipal Housing and Resettlement Office, housing needs in Guiguinto are evaluated and shall be addressed in the following years.
