# **MUNICIPALITY OF GUIGUINTO**

Guiguinto began as a barrio of Bulacan town, the former provincial capital of Bulacan. It is said that Spaniards set up an army post in the Barrio to serve as a resting place for forces going to Northern Luzon. In those days, travel throughout Guiguinto was difficult and slow down to cross single file over a narrow bamboo bridge. Their Filipino guides would cry out, "Hinto" (stop). The Spaniards thought this was the name "Hihinto". The Spaniards substituted "Gui" (with hard "g") for the Tagalog "Hi". The place has since been called Guiguinto. On the other hand, old timers say that on moonlight nights, a golden bull emerges from the church and goes down to the nearby river to quench his thirst. It then returns to the church, ascends at the altar and disappears. The elders' aid that there are buried jars of gold in town, as indicated by the bull, and that is why the town was called Guiguinto.

In 1800, a Spanish priest erected a small chapel in what is now barrio Sta. Rita. In 1873, roads were constructed in barrio Malis. The people of barrios of Pritil, Tabe, and Kutkut even those days were mostly farmers. During Holy Week, villagers of barrio Tuktukan held contest for the hardest egg shells (chicken, duck, or goose) by knocking eggs together therefore calling it Tuktukan. The women tried to help each other in singing the "Panica".

Just before the outbreak of the revolution of 1896, the town people of Guiguinto were ordered to sleep in the town at night and to work in their fields only in the day. This was said to have been suggested by the town priest to the authorities because of rumors that many of the town people were joining the secret revolutionary society, the Katipunan. Guiguinto eventually contributed many soldiers to the 1890 revolution.

Guiguinto became a municipality in 1915, with Antonio Figueroa as its first "Municipal President". The town's population was then about 4,000. The 1960 census placed Guiguinto's population at 10,629. Guiguinto is bounded on the East by the town of Balagtas, on the west by City of Malolos, on the North by Plaridel, and on the South by Bulakan.







Basic services are continuously provided for more efficient and economical services.

Human Resource Information System (HRIS) v1.2 for Payroll System and Personal Data Sheet Inventory were already operational since July 2017. E-BPLS (Online Business Permit and Licensing System) were also accessible through www.bpls.guiguinto.gov.ph which provides faster, convenient, and quality business licensing service. A total of 42 Closed-circuit televisions (CCTV) were already installed in different areas of the municipal building. Internet connection was also upgraded for faster connection.

In line with these, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto will continuously improve the effectiveness of the Quality Management System and services. All employees are encouraged to become responsive and motivated providing the highest level of public service.

# KARUNUNGAN

The Municipality of Guiauinto has an ultimate goal of providing the best quality education for the learner's holistic formation.

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto and the Department of Education ensure that the school facilities are being responsive to the changing requirements of Education Programs. School facilities are adequately provided and maintained for effective learning and better academic performance of students.

DepEd Guiguinto is keeping an eye on K-12 basic Education Program's implementation within the district along with a strong belief on its aim to revolutionize the Philippine's education and produce more competent citizens and prepare graduates for employment and lifelong learning.

# **DAYCARE CENTERS**

There are 20 day care centers strategically located in different barangays in the Municipality of Guiguinto with 20 Day Care Workers and 17 Day Care Workers Aide who are responsible for handling Supervised Neighborhood Play (SNP).

For the past three school years (SY2015-2016 to SY2017-2018), the average number of day care children is 1,937. With the standard ratio of one Day Care Worker for every 50 students, the Municipality of Guiguinto needs additional 19 Day Care Workers.






# **ELEMENTARY EDUCATION**

There are 14 Public Elementary Schools and 13 Private Elementary Schools accessible in different barangays in Guiguinto. As of end of 2017, there are 342 Elementary teachers and 11,843 enrollees. The Municipality was able to meet the standard ratio of one teacher for every 35 students. However, there is a need to improve the facilities and provide additional 105 classrooms to meet the standard ratio of 1:35 classroom-students ratio, which is far from the current 1:56 students in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

# **COMPLETION RATE - ELEMENTARY**

An increase of 1.12% in the 2015 to 2017 completion rate of elementary students was recorded.



### SECONDARY EDUCATION

As of 2017, three Public Secondary Schools are strategically located at barangay Poblacion, Sta. Rita, and Tiaong. Six Private Secondary Schools on the other hand are also accessible in Guiguinto wherein three are located in barangay Tabe, two in barangay Sta. Cruz, and one in barangay Poblacion.

The local government actively supports children with special needs in the municipality. Facilities for special education located at Central Elementary School were provided and teachers are trained to educate special education to these children.


# **ALTERNATIVE LEARNING SYSTEM (ALS)**

### ABC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM


The Municipal Government provides financial assistance to deserving college students of Guiguinto. For the year 2017, a total of P4,011,596.00 were allotted to 634 Guiguinteño students enrolled at different Universities and Colleges.

Scholars are ranked from A to C based on the scores of their prequalifying examination. Qualified students ranked from A to C receives semestral allowance of P5,000, P3,000 and P2,000 respectively. # KALINISAN AT KAPALIGIRAN

The local government of Guiguinto is working steadfast to attain a clean and safe environment as part of the vision and mission of municipality. Information, education, communication campaign were conducted about environmental protection as part of the 7K Program of the Municipality.



Currently, the Municipality have five serviceable elf trucks, two ten-wheeler trucks, a loader, backhoe, multicab, and a chariot. These vehicles are used on garbage collection, maintenance, dredging of waterways, and future infrastructure project and development in the Municipality.

As of 2017, there are 28 Ecoboys in the Municipality. Eco-Tribikes were given to 14 barangays which will be used by the Ecoboys for garbage collection from different houses while 6 garbage trucks and 1 loader are serviceable for the transfer of waste from barangay MRF to Central MRF.



# MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (MRF)

In compliance with Republic Act 9003 and as a support infrastructure for the Kalinisan program, Material Recovery Facilities (MRF) were established in 4 barangays (Tiaong, Malis, Tuktukan & llang-llang) where will the segregation and sorting of domestic wastes are processed.

Weekly inspections at MRFs are also being conducted. MRF in barangay Tiaong and Malis are segregating the organic materials to be use in order to produce a compost fertilizer which will be distributed to residents and different public schools for their plants or garden.

For the year 2017, a total of 1,030.24 metric tons of waste were collected in the Municipality of Guiguinto; 236.27 MT of biodegradable wastes, 12.17 MT of recyclables, and 781.70 MT of residual wastes.




Guiguinto MPS regularly conducts Checkpoint in strategic locations in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

# BAHAY PAGBABAGO AND BAHAY KANLUNGAN

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto together with the Pastoral group launched a program for the drug personalities through the development of Bahay Pagbabago and Bahay Kanlungan.

As of December 2017, 279 drug dependents have been rehabilitated in Bahay Pagbabago since it was opened in October 2016. They have undergone physical, psychosocial, and spiritual activities and have been given a second chance to live a decent life. Reformists are very thankful that the Municipal Government of Guiguinto and the Pastoral group helped them in transforming drug dependents to become employed and reformed individuals.

# **FIRE SAFETY**

In line with different fire incidents, Guiguinto Fire Station strictly implements Fire safety prevention programs such as Government Fire Brigade, Seminar with Private Establishments, Organize Fire Brigade, and close coordination with Local officials were also established by means of Barangay Ugnayan, and Kiddie Junior Fire Marshal within the area of responsibilities.

# STATUS OF FIRE STATION

The newly constructed Guiguinto Fire Station at Cloverleaf, Brgy. Sta. Cruz is occupied and operated by 14 Fire officers headed by Sinsp. Antonio C De Jesus Jr. The Municipal Government of Guiguinto donated the 811 sq.m lot to the BFP, including three serviceable fire trucks in the station in case of fire incidents. For the year 2017, a total of 1,676 business establishments were inspected which is 6% higher than the 2016 data.

# DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT

Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Office takes all actions possible to prevent disaster, reduce vulnerability of Municipality of Guiguinto to any disaster that may strike. MDRRMO also aims to establish their capabilities in protecting citizens from adverse effects of disasters, to respond effectively to actual occurrence of disasters and other risk, and to provide for the recovery in the aftermath of any emergency.

# BARANGAY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT

Coaching and mentoring of representatives from 14 barangays of Guiguinto for the development of Barangay Disaster Risk and Reduction and Management was conducted and facilitated by MDRRM Officer and Rescue Team of Guiguinto.

# **EMERGENCY ALERT AND ADVISORIES**

### Rain Gauge

The office acquired a rain gauge capable of hourly monitoring of the rainfall in the Municipality of Guiguinto. The device can help determine when to alert the citizens in case of heavy rains.

# Distribution and posting of different emergency signage to barangays

MDRRMO distributed different advisories and signage to all barangays in Guiguinto. There are also posters with regards to evacuation guide posted in the evacuation center.



# Emergency Equipment

The office acquired additional equipment for water related incidents and vehicular accidents.

# **DISASTER HANDBOOK**

MDRRMO distributed Disaster Handbook to elementary students around Guiguinto. It contains necessary information during calamities and disasters. The information is presented in comic stories to catch the attention of the students.



# **MDRRM PLAN**

The office has also prepared a Municipal Disaster and Risk Reduction Plan for the year 2016 to 2022 which will serve as a guide for the implementation of MDRRM Plan and Progress.



# **GUIGUINTO MASS WEDDING**

Because of the increasing births of children whose parents are not yet married (60% of total births in 2016), the Municipal Government of Guiguinto strongly promotes the mass wedding program which is conducted every February.





# KALUSUGAN

The Municipality of Guiguinto is committed to deliver a comprehensive, high quality, affordable, efficient, and sustainable health services for all residents. Through Municipal Health Office, achieving the health agenda "All for Health towards Health for All" which aims to ensure the best health outcome for all Filipinos, regardless of socio-economic class, ethnicity, gender, and geographic location was made possible.

# **HEALTH FACILITIES**

Health stations for the delivery of primary health care services such as basic consultation, health education, and referral to Rural Health Units (RHU) are accessible to 14 barangays of Guiguinto. Rural Health Units are also strategically located at barangay Poblacion (RHU 1) and barangay Tiaong (RHU 2) which provide health care services including consultation, basic treatment, maternal care, and referral of complicated cases to the next level hospital. There are also 44 private health facilities such as medical clinics, primary hospitals, and secondary hospitals in the Municipality.

# GINTONG KANLUNGAN

Gintong Kanlungan of Guiguinto Rural Health Unit II (RHU II) is continuously offering free consultation as the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) satellite treatment hub in response to HIV and Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) prevention and control. Vaginal Smear and Acetic acid wash is also available in health centers in the Municipality of Guiguinto. In 2017, 1,361 patients were screened and counselled, while 30 patients were given treatment.

### MATERNAL HEALTH PROGRAMS

In order to support women during pregnancy, childbirth, and their postpartum period, regular prenatal checkup once every trimester was conducted, 928 pregnant women were visited at home and given oral care, and 1,000 IEC materials were distributed. Other health services were also provided to preanant women such as:

- Free vaccination (Tetanus Toxoid)
- Free prenatal check up
- Free childbirth services for PhilHealth members
- Free immunization for newborns

# REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH/FAMILY PLANNING

Family Planning Counseling and different family planning supplies and services are being offered in different health centers in the Municipality of Guiguinto. This includes Bilateral Tubal Ligation (BTL), Vasectomy, Pills, Intrauterine Device (IUD), Depomedroxyprogesterone Acetate (DMPA), Natural Family Planning Cervical Mucus (NFP-CM), Natural Family Planning Basal Body Temperature (NFP-BBT), Natural Family Planning Sympto-Thermal Method (NFP-STM), Standard Days Method (SDM), Lactation Amenorrhea Method (LAM), Condom, and Implants.

#### TB DOTS

Free consultation, sputum test, and treatment for TB patients are being offered in different health centers in the Municipality of Guiguinto. In 2017, 30 individuals participated in UBOKABULARYO Seminar and Training which aimed to intensify awareness on infectious diseases. Free Direct Sputum Smear Microscopy (DSSM) was provided to 304 identified patients. Treatment for Pulmonary Tuberculosis using Directly Observed Treatment short course therapy (DOT) was also provided to 309 patients.

# ANIMAL BITE CENTER AND LEPROSY PROGRAM

Health facility is present in the Municipality of Guiguinto for vaccination and other treatments for prevention and control program. Active case finding and proper monitoring on victims were conducted and referral to external facilities if needed. Health teaching for leprosy awareness was also accomplished and 1,000 individuals participated in the program. Rabies vaccines were purchased and 450 patients benefited from this. Anti-rabies mass vaccination was also conducted in barangays and 4,276 dogs and 196 cats were vaccinated. In addition, 28 dogs were impounded in which 8 were released and 20 were euthanized.

# MENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION PROGRAM

The Municipality of Guiauinto established a program that provides mental health assistance, guidance to citizens with symptoms of depression and suicidal behavior, and protection of the rights of persons with mental problems. While those individuals experiencing drug and substance abuse undertakes drug testing, counseling, HIV testing, and Hepa B Vaccine.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL SANITATION PROGRAM**

Inspection, water disinfection, food sanitation, and other safety measures are being conducted before releasing health and sanitary permit to different establishments. There is also regular insect and vermin control to prevent dengue and other related diseases.

# **DENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM**

In accordance to the celebration of oral health month, "Sabayang Pagsesepilyo sa Bayan ng Guiguinto" is held in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Dental examination, tooth extraction, Oral Prophylaxis, tooth fillings, dental health teaching and visitations to Daycare Centers are regularly conducted to address oral health issues.

# HATAW: BALIK ALINDOG 2017

Zumba Marathon with the theme Hataw: Balik Alindog 2017 was held last February 2017 which aims to promote active and healthy lifestyle.



# **BARANGAY CIRCUMCISION**

In 2017, 791 patients have undergone free circumcision in 14 barangays of Guiguinto. This is held during April to May every

# OTHER HEALTH AWARENESS SERVICES

Guiguinteños may also visit Rural Health Units for other health services such as prevention and control for Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases, so as Cosmetic and Pathologic Dermatology services.



# MICRONUTRIENT SUPPLEMENTATION

Vitamin A Capsules under the "Araw ng Sangkap Pinoy (ASAP)" also known as Garantisadona Pambata is distributed every month of April and October.

# NUTRITION

Aside from the continuous formulation of plans and provision of necessary nutrition interventions, the Municipal Nutrition Committee also intensifies and thoroughly implements the different programs and activities of the Nutrition Action Plan to ensure the improvement of proper and adequate care especially for the children and pregnant women in our community.

# **SENIOR CITIZENS**

As of December 2017, 574 active members of Senior Citizens receives quarterly Social Pension amounting to P1,500. Aside from financial assistance, Senior Citizen Assembly were also conducted regularly. The Municipal Government will continuously support the Senior Citizens through different programs and activities.

# PERSONS WITH DISABILITY (PWD)

A total number of 1,104 Person with Disability (PWD) were issued I.D. with the same benefits given to senior citizens. Aside from that, 72 of the total PWDs are currently enrolled at Special Education (SPED). Special programs and other activities will be constantly provided for persons with disability in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

# **OSPITAL NG GUIGUINTO OPERATIONS**

# Philhealth Programs

Ospital ng Guiguinto participates in the Point of Care Program of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth). ONG was able to enroll 422 patients. The amount paid for enrollment was P1,012,800 to cover an accumulated hospital bill of Point of Care patients amounting to P2,221,714, giving the Ospital ng Guiguinto more than 50% savings.

Department of Health - Medical Health Care Assistance Program (MHCAP) & Hospital Facility Enhancement Programs (HFEP)

Ospital ng Guiguinto received 2.3 million pesos worth of hospital assistance for indigent patients.

Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) – Endowment Fund

Ospital ng Guiguinto is actively utilizing the PCSO endowment fund of P500,000 for financial assistance of indigent patients.





# KAUNLARAN

Revenue generation serves as the lifeblood of running a Local Government Unit. In order to keep with the continuous development, the Municipality has to be economically stable. In this light that the Municipal Government of Guiguinto strives to be efficient in local taxcollection.

Local taxes, permits and licenses, services, business and other revenue are the major sources of income of the local government. Biggest contributors to total income are from local taxes and the local government unit's share in Internal Revenue Allocation (IRA).

For the past 3 years, an average increase of 15.9%, average equivalent to P22 Million every year was collected from local taxes used to provide quality service and continuously develop the Municipality of Guiguinto. The increase in collection resulted to a decrease in IRA Dependency which proves that the Municipality of Guiguinto is performing better financial management.

# INFRASTRUCTRE DEVELOPMENT

The Municipality of Guiguinto is committed to maintain adequate infrastructures that support and strengthen various socioeconomic activities of the people.

This development attracts investor on capitalizing in the municipality which will help in providing employment opportunities and assist in improving the quality of life of Guiguinteños.

The development at the back of Guiguinto Municipal Athletic and Cultural Center (GMACC), which will serve as a tourism venture and assembly venue in the Municipality of Guiguinto is currently in progress.



In line with this, different local roads are being constructed including Mercado Street, Malis, Pritil, NIA Road, Gonzales St. of Tabe, Mañalac St. of Poblacion, and roads in Sta. Cruz and Sta. Rita.

New Industrial Estates are likely to be established in the areas of barangays Malis, Tabe, and Tiaong. This will provide additional employment opportunities for Guiguinteños.

This year, 50 Guiguinteño families will benefit from the 50 Housing Units approved by the National Housing Authority. Priority to relocatees include informal settlers and those residing in hazardous areas. The construction of these housing units will be executed in 2018.


Additional apartment type niches at Guiguinto Municipal Cemetery located in Tabang were constructed to complement the congested Municipal Cemetery at barangay Poblacion. The Municipality ensures that only those who do not have the funds for private memorial plot would benefit from this project.

Other projects in line for implementation in 2018 initiated by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto include the construction of Material Recovery Facility (MRF) in every barangay and the Sta. Cruz-Tabana Cloverleaf Development.

# **BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS**

Through the help of Business Permit and Licensing Office, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto was able to provide fast, convenient, and systematic processing of regulatory documents that serves as an integral generating income for the municipality. Various permits and licenses were provided through precise assessment of taxes under the compliance of the existing Revenue Code.

For the year 2017, the BPLO was able to register 592 new application and 1,592 renewal of permit resulting to revenue collection 20.12% higher than the 2016 data.


# TAX CAMPAIGN AND BUSINESS INSPECTION

# KABUHAYAN

Guiguinto is one of the municipalities with economy strongly based on tertiary sector activities like commerce, real estate, and personal and community services in the Municipality of Guiguinto. The Municipal Government of Guiguinto also utilizes effort to develop the booming horticulture business since the vision is to be the Garden Capital of the Philippines.

# PRIMARY SECTOR

In order to attain the goal of sustaining agriculture proclaims in the Municipality of Guiguinto, various programs were being conducted.

#### SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT OF THE AND **GOVERNMENT STUDENTS INTERNSHIP PROGRAM**

Special Program for Employment of the Students (SPES) is conducted every year as mandated under Republic Act No. 9547. About 163 students were hired by different companies/agencies in Guiguinto, while 24 individuals benefited from the Government Internship Program.

# **JOB FAIR**

Every year, job fair is conducted to provide linkage between employers and jobseekers. In 2017, 33 companies participated in which 26 offer local jobs and seven offer overseas jobs. About 330 applicants were registered, 256 of them were qualified and 66 were hired.



# JOB REFERRAL AND PLACEMENT

For 2017, 1,996 out of 2,856 (70%) registered job applicants in Public Employment Service Office (PESO) of Guiguinto were referred to different companies and additional 8,340 job vacancies were solicited wherein 2,052 (25%) job applicants were placed. In addition to job placement, Local Recruitment Authority (LRA) and Special Recruitment Authority (SRA) also help in addressing unemployment and skills-job mismatch.

There were also seminars conducted that serve as initial step when applying for local and overseas employment. In 2017, a total of 2,952 individuals benefited from the event.

# LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMS

Livelihood programs were also provided to the ambulant vendors in Guiguinto with the objective of engaging them into viable and sustainable self-employment undertakings. More than 200 Livelihood Starter Kits were distributed to micro and small-scale business owners. Meanwhile 50 OFW beneficiaries were given Bread and Pastry Training at Kusina ng Bayan, Brgy. Sta. Cruz as part of Skills Training Program. This shared service facility was funded by DTI-BUB and was intended to prepare the trainees for self-employment.



# PUHUNAN NI BOY (PNB) LOAN

More than P3 Million financial assistance were given to 679 beneficiaries of PNB Loan. These additional funds are being offered to entrepreneurs to sustain existing small businesses in Guiguinto.

### **E-PASSPORT MOBILE**

A total of 820 passport applicants were screened and 726 were approved during the conduct of E-Passport Mobile. This program has been very beneficial because it minimize the time and effort in the processing of passports.



# KABATAAN

One of the goals of the Municipality of Guiguinto is to recognize and develop the potential of the young Guiguinteños. Various seminars, projects, and activities are conducted to help the youth develop social, ethical, leadership, and value formation.

# GUIGUINTO SCHOLARS ASSOCIATION (GSA)

Guiguinto Scholarship Association was established in the first term of Mayor Ambrosio C. Cruz, Jr. in 1998 which his salary for the whole year was given to the ABC Scholars and eventually, it became a non-government organization after the term of Mayor Cruz in 2007. By 2013, when Mayor Cruz was reelected, GSA was given a budget under PIARO to continuously support the scholars of Guiguinto.

Recently, GSA was recognized in Ten Accomplished Youth Orgaization (TAYO) and Sineliksik Bulacan Docu Fest. In order to attract other Guiguinteño youths to actively participate in different activities that may help improve their talents and develop their skills, GSA are conducting programs such as:

#### History Telling

A project that aims to share the importance of Guiguinto History (Sulyap sa Nakaraan) through lights and sounds presentation.

# Guintong Pandayan

An annual workshop that cultivates youth appreciation to different forms of arts is conducted every year. It aims to enhance youth talents and capabilities through dancing, singing, acting, and painting.

# Guintong Pluma

A contest for young individuals in literature and feature writing is held annualy at the District Office, Guiguinto Central School which aims to develop youth's creative thinking and skills in writing.



### LINGGO NG KABATAAN

In accordance with the Presidential Proclamation No. 99 s. 1992 declaring the celebration of "Linggo ng Kabataan", the Municipality of Guiguinto regularly conducts a yearly "Boy and Girl Official" wherein youths are being trained on how to govern local agencies by having a counterpart department.

# YOUTH CAMP

There were 39 Lingkod Kabataan who participated in Youth Camp held last June 2017 at Klir Waterpark Resort. The event aims to develop youth leaders and let them appreciate new challenges through volunteering and social action whilst making a positive contribution to the community. Summer Youth Sport fest was also held and Guiguinto Basketball Team was established for the Government's Cup.



# LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, AND TRANSGENDER (LGBT)

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto recognizes the LGBT community. In line with this, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto conducted activities for the LGBT which was facilitated by PIARO.

# **2018 PRIORITY PROJECTS**

# GUIGUINTO PEOPLE'S PARK AND ATHLETIC OVAL

About 2.0 hectares of lot will be developed at the back of Guiguinto Municipal Athletic and Cultural Center (GMACC), which will serve as a tourism venture and assembly venue in the Municipality of Guiguinto. A stadium, amphitheater, athletic oval, and park will soon rise in the area. The stadium and amphitheater will be used for different events such as concerts, assembly, and other athletic events. This project will also further help the beneficiaries of Puhunan ng Bayan, Puhunan ni Boy, and Dagdag Puhunan programs through the proposed food park within the area. The development and growing of ornamental plants and native trees at the park shall serve as a representation of Guiguinto as the Garden Capital of the Philippines.

# MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY

Construction of Material Recovery Facility in every barangay initiated in 2017 shall continue in 2018 for proper management of solid waste generated in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

# CONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION OF BARANGAY

Accessible and well maintained roads shall remain among the top priorities of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto for 2018. Mercado Street, Gonzales St. of Tabe, Manalac St. of Poblacion, NIA Road, and roads in Sta. Cruz, Sta. Rita, Malis, and Pritil will be constructed.

# CLOVERLEAF DEVELOPMENT AT BARANGAY STA. CRUZ-TABANG

The Sta.Cruz-Tabang Cloverleaf featuring Transport Terminal, Food Park, Commercial Center, and Garden Showcase Area will be developed starting 2018 and shall serve as another tourism spot and activity center in the Municipality of Guiguinto.


# IMPROVED INCIDENT MANAGEMENT AND RESPONSE CAPABILITIES


