### MUNICIPALITY OF GUIGUINTO

The name "Guiguinto" literally translates to "Gold". The early conquistadores went to this town on a harvest season when it lushes in golden rice stalks against the sun. Through the pages of history, Guiguinto gave justice to its name for it proved to be of great political worth, abounding in agricultural riches and of its strategic import since the times of the Encomienda in the 1590's.

In 1951, the Municipality of Guiguinto was one of the territorial classification of the Spaniards known as the "Encomienda" referring to the parcelization of land for taxation purposes.

Known by its ancient name "Ma-yi", the Province of Bulacan is believed to have been settled long before the Spanish Explorer came to the Philippines. These settlements were organized by the Spaniards into early towns called "Pueblos" which include the town of Guiguinto. Guiguinto was founded in 1641.

In 1903, the 25 municipalities of Bulacan were reduced to 13. With this consolidation, Guiguinto became part of the Municipality of Bulacan. Since then, several other divisions and modifications have been done on the territorial boundaries of the towns in the Province of Bulacan.

However, on 24 December 1914, Governor General Francis Burton Harrison issued Order Ejecutiva No. 126 (Executive Order No. 126) separating Guiguinto from the Municipality of Bulacan, Bulacan.

Hence, on January 1, 1915 Guiguinto started to be recognized as an independent municipality with Antonio Figueroa as its first "Municipal President". The town's population was then about 4,000.




### MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF GUIGUINTO


#### CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

In accordance to Republic Act 6972, an act that requires the establishment of Child Development Center in each barangay, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto has established additional four Child Development Centers in addition to 20 CDC in 2017. These additional centers are located at Brgy. Tuktukan, Brgy. Poblacion and Brgy. Sta. Cruz. For the year 2018, the total 24 Child Development Centers are serving 1,806 children.



#### **ELEMENTARY EDUCATION**

The 14 Public Elementary Schools and 13 Private Elementary Schools in different barangays in Guiguinto were able to keep the standard ratio of one teacher for every 35 students. For the school year 2017-2018, there are more than 400 Elementary teachers and 15,984 enrollees.



The need to improve the facilities and provide additional classrooms to meet the standard ratio of 1:35 classroom-student ratio is being addressed by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto. As of December 2018, 52 additional classrooms and educational facilities, 6,227 books/reviewers, and 337 computer/TV sets were given to different schools in the Municipality of Guiguinto.



#### **ELEMENTARY COMPLETION RATE**

DepEd Guiguinto recorded an increase of 0.64 percent from SY 2015 to 2018 completion rate of Elementary students.

#### SECONDARY EDUCATION

As of 2018, four Public Secondary Schools are strategically located at barangays Malis, Poblacion, Sta. Rita, and Pulonggubat. Private Secondary Schools on the other hand are also accessible in Guiguinto.

For the School Year 2018-2019, four Public Secondary Schools have 317 High School Teachers teaching 7,410 High School Students while three Public Senior High Schools have 94 Senior High School Teachers teaching 2,099 Senior High School Students.

#### TERTIARY EDUCATION

Tertiary and Vocational education are provided by public and private institutions in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Immaculate Concepcion Major Seminary in barangay Tabe offers Tertiary education. Technical, Vocational, and Training Centers are also present such as ATEC Technological College in Sta. Rita, Global Alliance Technological Institute Corp. in Sta. Cruz, SAGE Asian Language and Education Center Bulacan Inc. in Sta. Cruz, and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) in Tabang.

#### SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EDUCATION

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto supports Special Program for Education. The Special Science Elementary School (SSES) that enrich the Science curriculum in public elementary schools have 409 enrollees in 2018. Through Alternative Learning System (ALS), ladderized non-formal education program is offered to Guiguinteños as practical option from the existing formal education. There are three ALS teachers in Guiguinto serving 377 ALS Learners in 2018. In addition, there are also 102 enrollees in Special Education (SPED) with five SPED teachers as of 2018.

#### SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto continuously provide financial assistance to deserving Guiguinteño college students enrolled at different Universities and Colleges. In 2018, Php 5.2 Million were allotted for Scholarship Program granting a total of 1,372 students semestral allowance.

Scholars are categorized based on the scores of their prequalifying exam and school grades. An increase of 14 percent in the number of scholars from the previous year was recorded. The Municipal Government of Guiguinto will continuously supporting the increasing number of deserving students in


The Municipal Government of Guiguinto is committed in providing its citizen a safe environment. As stipulated in the Local Government Code, the enforcement of laws on cleanliness and sanitation, and preparation of the solid waste management programs will be ensured for the welfare of every Guiguinteño.

#### SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto intensifies the implementation of Solid Waste Management Scheme in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Various programs and projects are launched in different schools and barangays to encourage Guiguinteños on proper waste disposal and minimize waste generation.

#### Solid Waste Management Fee

Information, education, and communication campaign on business establishments, homeowner's association, and barangays are continuously conducted by the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources to remind them regarding the imposition of fee on Solid Waste Management based on the Municipal Ordinance No. 210 Series of 2015 Revised Revenue Code which states that



"There shall be collected a Solid Waste Management Fee (SWMF) of P2,500 per truck load of 3 tons of solid waste from every owner or operator of commercial, industrial or other types of business establishments which shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer with an order of payment issued by MENRO. An initial amount of P10,000 will be collected from the business establishment in equivalent of 12 tons of their solid waste upon the application of business permits a proof of their waste tonnage attach a truck scale results.

An amount of P30 per month shall be imposed per household/ apartment unit payable every 5th day of the month, 80% of the amount collected by the barangay shall be issued solely for the implementation of environmental projects of the Barangay and 20% of the collection will be remitted to the Municipal Treasurer"

# 10-YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

The 10-year Solid Waste Management Plan of the Municipality of Guiguinto presented by MENRO head, Engr. Sudan Carreon was approved by the National Solid Waste Management Commission through NSWMC Resolution No. 1080 series of 2018. All specified activities in the plan will be implemented and monitored by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto to ensure the efficient management of solid wastes generated in the municipality.

# MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES INVOLVEMENT IN SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Municipal employees are also required to use reusable containers and tumblers as support in the implementation of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Recover, and Refuse program. Municipal employees are being discouraged to use disposable plastic bottles, containers, and polystyrene.



# MARKET PARTICIPATION IN SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Business establishments are also urged to avoid waste of potentially useful materials, to reduce the consumption of fresh raw materials, reduce energy usage, reduce air and water pollution by reducing the need for "conventional" waste disposal, and lower greenhouse gas emission. Orientation of market owners, market personnel, and stall owners are conducted.

#### I-REFILL - REFILL REVOLUTION

In celebration of Earth month and with the promotion to end plastic pollution, the first ever refill revolution is launched by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto in coordination with DENR and in partnership with private corporations selling basic commodities. More than 1,000 Guiguinteños participated during the event, with clean empty bottles to be filled with condiments that can be purchased in lower prices. The event aims to discourage residents from buying commodities sold in single-used plastics.

# DREDGING AND RIPRAPPING OF GUIGUINTO RIVER

As part of the Flood Control Project, the Municipality of Guiguinto conducts dredging and riprapping of waterways. In 2018, 1.8kms of revetments and embankments were constructed along with dredging and riprapping of Guiguinto River. This flood control projects have resulted to around 40,500m³ of dredge spoil, sludge, and other liquid wastes removed from the river.



#### **ABC LANTERN COMPETITION**

A Blissful Christmas Lantern competition hosted by the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources was participated by 14 barangays. #### INFORMATION EDUCATION CAMPAIGN

Environmental education for the educators, barangay employees, and purok leaders are held as part of the information education campaign on environmental laws and waste management of the Municipality of Guiguinto. #### **CLEAN-UP ACTIVITIES**

Regular clean-up activities are conducted in the Municipality of Guiguinto. Barangay Volunteers, Senior High School students, PNP Guiguinto, Guiguinto Scholars Association, and municipal employees actively participate in the event.



#### MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (MRF)

The Municipal Environment and Natural Resources conducts regular weekly inspection at four MRFs located in barangay llang-llang, Malis, Tiaong, and Tuktutukan.

In 2018, a total of 2,275,642 MT of waste were collected in the Municipality of Guiguinto; 68,479 MT of biodegradable wastes, 458,223 MT of non-biodegradable wastes, and 1,748,940 MT of residual wastes.

For preparedness, mitigation, prevention, and response to any form of disaster, the Municipal Risk Reduction and Management Council together with Guiguinto Rescue Team and Traffic Management Group, takes all actions to establish capabilities in protecting citizens and effectively respond to the needs of every Guiguinteño.



# SUGOD GUIGUINTO COMMAND CENTER (SGCC)

SGCC is the first fiber optic-powered command center in Bulacan. It monitors peace and order and public safety in the Municipality of Guiguinto and ready to respond to any kinds of emergency and incidents 24/7.



# MDRRMO GUIGUINTO OPERATIONS CENTER

In line with the establishment of SGCC, the MDRRMO Guiguinto Operations Center is transformed into a fully-equipped and modern office to better serve the Guiguinteños.



#### **DISASTER PREPAREDNESS**

To ensure preparedness and immediate response to any disaster Standard Operating Procedures for Incident Command System, Operation Center, Pre-Emptive Evacuation, Local Climate Change Action Plan, Evacuation Center Management, Prepositioning of Goods, Relief Operation, Medical and Security Services, and Early Warning System.









# CRIME RATE AND CRIME SOLUTION EFFICIENCY

#### Anti-Drug Abuse Council

The Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC) and Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (BADAC) in coordination with the Guiguinto MPS intensifies its campaign against illegal drugs. Members of Guiguinto Tokhang Team, Pastoral Group, and ADAC, conducts house visitation to former BADAC watchlisted surrenderees.



#### **Oplan JOEL**

As the new Acting Chief of Police of Guiguinto Municipal Police Station, PSupt. Joel B. Aparejado launched the Oplan JOEL in Guiguinto which stands for Just One Endeavor Law enforcers that encourage his team to act as one and serve with one goal.

#### **OPLAN Katok**

Continuous implementation of Guiguinto MPS against loose firearms and verification of unrenewed firearms.

#### Violation of Election Gun Ban

During the Barangay Election, Guiguinto MPS together with Municipal COMELEC conducted checkpoint which resulted into the arrest of a civilian and confiscation of 9mm pistol.

#### **Oplan RODY**

Operation to Rid the street Of Drunkards and Youth (RODY) is regularly conducted by night shift patrollers in 14 barangays in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

#### **OPLAN Greyhound**

Regular inspection at Guiguinto MPS Detention Facility is conducted to ensure that there are no contrabands and deadly weapons inside the detention facility.

#### Dalaw sa Barangay

In line with the continuous efforts on Anti-Criminality and Anti-Illegal Drugs Campaign, continuous Information Dissemination, Community Awareness, and Strengthening of Barangay Peace-keeping Action Team, Guiguinto MPS conducted visitation/dialogue with barangay captains and barangay tanods.

#### Regular Spiritual Nourishment

In coordination with different religious groups, spiritual nourishment through weekly morale recovery and spiritual uplifting is regularly conducted in Guiguinto Municipal Police Station.

#### Sama-samang Sikad ng Mamamayan at Kapulisan tungo sa Kapayapaan

This project promotes active relationship between the Guiguinto MPS and community.

#### **Oplan SUMVAC**

Public assistance and help desk were situated in different strategical location in the Municipality of Guiguinto during the observance of Holy Week and summer vacation.

#### Oplan Kaluluwa and Ligtas Undas 2018

During the observance of All Saints Day and All Souls Day, Guiguinto MPS was able to maintain peace and order. Police Assistance Hub were strategically located in different cemeteries.

#### Oplan Ligtas Paskuhan and Iwas Bawal Paputok 2018

Guiguinto MPS conducted information dissemination regarding common modus operandi and indiscriminate firing during the season. Guiguinto MPS also conducted inspections at different fire cracker zones/stalls to ensure safe and peaceful celebration of Christmas and New Year in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

#### **FIRE SAFETY**

Guiguinto Fire Station strictly implements fire safety prevention programs such as Ugnayan sa Barangay, Junior Kiddie Fire Marshal, Seminar with private establishments, Fire Brigade, and close coordination with Local officials. Industrial Fire Safety Seminars and Drills were also conducted among different establishments in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

#### MATERNAL AND CHILD CARE

Regular prenatal checkup once every trimester were conducted to support women during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum period. In 2018, 100 percent or 2,143 pregnant women in the Municipality of Guiguinto undergone prenatal visits and were given oral care. On the other hand, 1,371 children below one year old are fully immunized. The Municipal Government of Guiauinto will continuously promote proactive, preventative and strateaic approach to promoting the health and development of pregnant women families with infants and young children in the Municipality of Guiguinto.





# FAMILY PLANNING AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH PROGRAMS

In 2018, 4,137 individuals benefited from health reproductive programs the Municipality of Guiguinto. These programs include provision of family planning supplies and services such as Bilateral Tubal Ligation (BTL), Vasectomy, Pills, Intrauterine Device (IUD), Depomedroxyprogesterone Acetate (DMPA), Natural Family Planning Cervical Mucus (NFP-CM), Natural Family Planning Basal Body Temperature (NFP-BBT), Natural Family Planning Sympto-Thermal Method (NFP-STM), Standard Days Method (SDM), Amenorrhea Method Lactation (LAM), Condom, and Implants.

#### TEENAGE PREGNANCY

The swelling problem in teenage pregnancy was effectively addressed by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto. A decrease of 39% in a year in the prevalence of teenage pregnancy was recorded. The Home Visitation Program lead by the Guiguinto Population Office was seen effective in addressing other health related problems and mishandling of family conflicts which sometimes lead to insurgence and teenage pregnancy.



#### TUBERCULOSIS PROGRAM

About 249 confirmed Tuberculosis cases were recorded for the year 2018. 25% of which are minor and the Municipality of Guiguinto is providing actions for identified patients. Treatment for Pulmonary Tuberculosis using Directly Observed Treatment (DOT) short course therapy was provided. Aside from that, there are free consultation, sputum test, and treatment being offered in health centers in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

#### DENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

Basic Oral Health Care (BOHC) which include oral examination, oral Prophylaxis, and removal of tooth decay. Essential health package (toothpaste, toothbrush, and soap) were given to 986 children, pregnant women, and elderly in different barangays of Guiguinto.

# ENVIRONMENT SANITATION PROGRAM

Regular insect and vermin control to prevent the dengue and other related diseases are conducted by the Municipal Health Office. Aside from that, business establishments are required to apply for health and sanitary permit which requires inspection, water disinfection, and other safety measures. Food handlers are also required to secure health certificate.

#### ANTI-DENGUE CAMPAIGN

Monthly mist spraying or mosquito fogging is conducted in every barangay especially to the areas prone to dengue cases such as public and private schools, and residential areas along waterways. Guiguinteños are also advised to cooperate by continuously preventing possible dengue mosquitoes breeding in their surroundings.

#### OTHER HEALTH SERVICES

- Prevention and control for Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases
- Cosmetic and Pathologic Dermatology services

#### **NUTRITION ADVOCACY**

In celebration of Nutrition month with the theme "Ugaliing Magtanim, Sapat na Nutrisyon Aanihin", the Municipal Government of Guiguinto through Municipal Nutrition Office conducted activities for the promotion of healthy food consumption, improvement of nutrition, and prevention of malnutrition caused by food insecurity.

"Malunggay Kahit Saan Contest" was launched to promote increasing number of households, schools, and communities engaged in backyard aardenina with amona families malnourished children. There is also a Junior Master Chef's Cooking Contest participated by 31 DEPED District Schools in Bulacan in which Guiguinto won the 3rd place. Aside from "Nutri-mural contest" that, there is a by the 14 participated Barangays of Guiguinto as part of the nutrition advocacy.

The Municipal Nutrition Office also organized a cooking demonstration in coordination with the company Chef, Nutritionist-Dietician, and other staff of Ajinomoto Philippines Food Flavor Inc. The theme of the event is "Gulay at prutas na ating itinanim halina't ating lutuin at kainin, Sustansyang hatid nito'y dapat sulitin".

# REDUCTION OF STUNTING AND WASTING CHILDREN

Solving the Stunting and Wasting condition is one of the priorities of the Municipality of Guiguinto. Programs are being provided to lower the prevalence of wasting and stunting among children and prevent development of micronutrient deficiency diseases. Stores and food establishments in Guiguinto are also encourage to start selling fortified food items.

# NUTRITION EDUCATION AND COUNSELLING

Group counseling are conducted to educate parents and guardians of the malnourished pre-school children about the effects of consuming food low in vitamin A, Iron, and lodine. They are encourage to develop a kitchen garden and plant sources of Vitamin A, Iron, and lodine and prevent family members from developing deficiency disorders.


MNO facilitates nutrition education with discussions on nutritional guidelines, food guide pyramid, Pinggang Pinoy, and 10 Kumainments. Proper diet and regular physical activities are promoted in the Municipality of Guiguinto to prevent early physiological aging that causes non-communicable diseases.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL FEEDING PROGRAM

Supplementary feeding is one of the basic yet practical interventions effective and lowering the incidence of malnutrition. The Municipality of Guiguinto together with the Municipal nutrition Office and Municipal Committee Nutrition launched Supplementary Feeding which aims to improve the nutritional condition of the malnourished preschool children specifically the underweight and edify the parents of the identified underweight about the importance of proper meal planning and quality but economical food choices for nutritional condition of their children.

Average decrease of 32% in the prevalence of severely underweight among preschool children


#### Severely Underweight

Average decrease of 27% in the prevalence of underweight among preschool children


#### **Underweight**

#### PERSONS WITH DISABILITY (PWDS)

Through BUB Fund, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto was able to provide wheelchairs to 24 PWDs in need. Aside from that, there is a reorganization of PWD Federation to further alleviate the PWD Sector. The Municipality of Guiguinto is also making efforts to strengthen equalization of opportunities for the PWDs.

#### SENIOR CITIZEN

As of 2018, 8,888 senior citizens benefited from the programs and activities of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto. Regular monthly meeting are conducted by the Federation of Senior Citizen from the 14 barangays of Guiguinto. The Municipality of also participating is recognition of the contribution of the elderly citizens in the nation building Proclamation No. 470 declaring every October as the Elderly Filipino Week.

In addition, to further support the Indigent Senior Citizens in the Municipality of Guiguinto, additional P500 on top of the P1,500 financial assistance has been approved under the Social Pension Program.

#### OSPITAL NG GUIGUINTO

Ospital ng Guiguinto was rehabilitated to further improve facilities for patients. Sufficient and modern medical devices and equipment are acquired for saving lives. The Municipal Government of Guiguinto ensures that ONG can operate efficiently and provide adequate medical care to patients.

# OSPITAL NG GUIGUINTO OPERATIONS

#### **Newborn Care Package Programs**

Ospital ng Guiguinto (ONG) in coordination with Philhealth and Department of Health ensure the well-being of infant through the Newborn Care Package Programs which includes Hepatitis B Vaccination, Bacillus Calmette—Guérin (BCG) Vaccination, and newborn screening to detect congenital diseases.

#### Philhealth Programs

Since 2014, ONG participates in the Point of Care Program of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) through Office Order No. 2013-0031 which aims to enroll indigent patients as members of the PhilHealth. ONG was able to enroll 227 patients wherein the amount paid for enrollment was P1,357,473.00 worth of hospital bills.

Department of Health — Medical Health Care Assistance Program (MHCAP) and Hospital Facility Enhancement Program (HFEP)

Ospital ng Guiguinto received P2.7 Million worth of hospital assistance for indigent patients from MHCAP and P7 Million worth of infrastructure from HFEP.

### Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) – Endowment Fund

Ospital ng Guiguinto is actively utilizing the PCSO endowment fund of P500,000 for financial assistance of indigent patients.


#### ANTI-RABIES CAMPAIGN

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto conducts regular Anti-Rabies awareness seminar in all barangays in Guiguinto. There is also registration of all vaccinated dogs and cats. As of August 2018, 4,989 dogs and 412 cats were vaccinated. In addition, there is also catching of stray dogs in the Municipality of Guiguinto.

### **KAUNLARAN**

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto strives to improve tax administration, tax structures, increase in tax collections, and boost financial management to provide quality services, ensure better future for the young generation, and continuously develop the Municipality of Guiguinto.

An average increase of 14%, equivalent to average of P31 Million annually was collected from local taxes for the past three years. The increase in collection resulted to a stability in Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) Dependency which proves the existence of better financial performance of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto.





#### FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT

As part of the Flood Control Project of the Municipality of Guiguinto, a total of 2,350 meters of canal and drainage located in different barangays were cleaned and declogged. In addition, continuous dredging and riprapping of Guiguinto River is executed.

#### **BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS**

Business sector in the Municipality of Guiguinto is continuously expanding from 2013 to 2018 with around 150 percent equivalent to 3,413 jobs. For the year 2018, Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) was able to register 593 new application and 1,832 renewal of permit resulting to average revenue collection 18.15% higher than the previous three years.

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto integrates all departments involved in the issuance of permits in one area for Business One-Stop-Shop (BOSS).

# TAX CAMPAIGN AND BUSINESS INSPECTION

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto established Guiguinto Joint Inspection Team which includes various offices in coordination with barangay representative, Bureau of Customs, Department of the Interior and Local Government, and Department of Trade and Industry conducts regular tax campaign and continuous inspection of enterprises to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and revocation of business permits and order of closure for violations.

#### DICT E-BPLS TRAINING AND SEMINAR

The Department of Information and Communication Technology (DICT) in cooperation with Guiguinto BPLO conducted a three-day training and seminar to promote and teach municipal employees and business clients on how to use E-BPLS.

#### TRADE FAIR

During the celebration of Halamanan Festival, **Guiguinto Trade Fair** was launched by the Municipal Government of Guiguinto. The ribbon cutting and grand opening was led by Mayor Ambrosio C. Cruz, Jr. together with the DTI Regional Director Judith R. Angeles and DTI Provincial Director Zoring Aldana.

#### BENCHMARKING IN GUIGUINTO

The BPLO Head and staff of City of San Jose Del Monte, Municipality of Baliwag, Paombong, Plaridel, Pulilan, and City of Malolos, conducted benchmarking activities in the Municipality of Guiguinto for the ISO 9001:2015 licensing procedure.

#### KAPIHAN WITH MAYOR

Kapihan with Mayor was successfully conducted through BPLO. Sugod Guiguinto Business Council, barangays of Guiguinto, and other taxpayers participated in the event. Award for the top 10 corporations, top 10 single proprietors, and barangay with highest number of business establishments for the year 2018 were given.



#### **DTI-NEGOSYO CENTER**

Negosyo Center was recently established in Guiguinto which aims to promote ease of doing business and easy access of services for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). In coordination with the barangays, Negosyo Center also conducts free seminar on Entrepreneurial Development under Negosyo Serbisyo sa Barangay program of DTI Bulacan that envisions to bring Negosyo Center services to the grass-root levels of the community.

#### **INVESTORS IN GUIGUINTO**

In relevance to various construction and rehabilitation of roads in the Municipality of Guiguinto, job opportunities for every Guiguinteños become rampant.

Additional four private industrial centers were constructed. Proof that investors are trusting the Municipality of Guiguinto. Vibrant business is equivalent to additional job opportunities.

### **KABUHAYAN**

The support of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto to address the unemployment and ameliorate the standard of living of every Guiguinteño has been evident through various employment and livelihood programs launched by the current administration.

Every Guiquinteño applicant is guaranteed with prompt, timely and efficient delivery of employment service and provided with adequate information on other Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) programs. Guiquinto Aside from that, the **Public Employment** Service Office conducts networking with other PESOs for job exchange purposes.

#### SKILLS TRAINING CENTER

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto's target to establish its own Skills Training Center as part of the livelihood and employment program has been realized in 2018. This will provide specialized training facility with heavy equipment since one of the most in demand jobs in the labor market is equipment operator. In addition, this will in-house other skills training programs such as bread and pastry making,

#### SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM

It has been more than 500 Guiguintenos were skills provided with new and entrepreneurial skills and more than 3,000 given livelihood as part Sustainable Livelihood **Program** of the Municipal Government of Guiguinto.

Additional 85 beneficiaries received Livelihood Starter Kit amounting to P750,000 from the Municipal Government of Guiguinto and DOLE. Aside from that, additional 13 OFW benefited from Pangkabuhayan Starter Kit for OFW Program which involved an amount of P130,000 from DOLE. These livelihood starter kits were distributed to prepare beneficiaries for sustainable self-employment.



### PUHUNAN NI BOY (PNB) LOAN

2018, additional 591 1,991 For on beneficiaries 2015 for **PNB** since Loan amounting to P2,955,000. More than P13 Million was released to the beneficiaries since the program started. This aims to provide additional capital and assist small-scale entrepreneurs in Guiguinto.

# TULONG PANGKABUHAYAN PARA SA ATING DISADVANTAGED WORKERS (TUPAD)

In order to provide employment for non-skilled workers, Tulong Pangkabuhayan Para sa Ating Disadvantaged Workers (TUPAD) was conducted. An increase of 41% from the previous year's TUPAD beneficiaries was recorded.

# PRE-EMPLOYMENT ORIENTATION SEMINAR (PEOS), LABOR EDUCATION FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS (LEGS) AND ANTI-ILLEGAL RECRUITMENT/ TRAFFICKING-IN-PERSON (AIR-TIP)

In order to further assist Guiguinteños applying for local and overseas employment, various seminars such as Pre-Employment Orientation Seminar (PEOS), Labor Education for Graduating Students (LEGS) and Anti-Illegal Recruitment/ Trafficking-In-Person (AIR-TIP). About 2,349 individuals benefited from the events.

#### **JOB FAIR**

To provide linkage between employees and jobseekers, job fair is conducted every year. About 1,362 job vacancies were solicited, 222 job applicants were registered, 143 job applicants were qualified and 40 were hired on the spot.

#### JOB REFERRAL AND PLACEMENT

For 2018, 6,382 job vacancies were solicited. There is an annual increase of 19% in the number of job applicants registered, 39% in job applicants referred, and 30% job applicants placed/hired.

In addition to job placement, Local Recruitment Authority (LRA) and Special Recruitment Authority (SRA) assist in addressing unemployment and skills-job mismatch.

### CAREER GUIDANCE ORIENTATION SEMINAR (CGOS)

Due to increasing number of students, the Municipal Government of Guiguinto intensifies the conduct of Career Guidance Orientation Seminar to Grade 10 Students to address the mismatch of educational qualification and industry needs by guiding the students in choosing educational track in Senior High School and College. About 34 sessions with 2,775 attendees were conducted in different Public High Schools in Guiguinto.



### SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT OF THE STUDENTS (SPES)

As mandated under Republic Act No. 9547, Special Program for Employment of the Students (SPES) was regularly conducted. For 2018, 113 students were hired during academic vacation. This help students to provide additional funds for their school expenses.

#### **E-PASSPORT MOBILE**

In coordination with Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), 682 passport applications were approved. Half of this figure was processed and released in the Municipality of Guiguinto through E-Passport Mobile while the rest are facilitated at DFA Aseana with the provision of shuttle service by the Municipal Government.

### PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM (4PS)

Main objectives:

- a. Social Assistance (short term goal of the program) monetary assistance;
- b. Social Development (long term goal of the program) – with conditions that focuses on Education, Health and Family Development before they can get their monetary assistance.

For 2018, there are 1,353 beneficiaries of 4Ps. They are required to establish backyard gardening to have a bio-intensive garden to complement the Rice Subsidy given to them.

#### **AGRICULTURE**

The Municipal Government of Guiguinto is continuous with its efforts to develop the Municipality without aggravating the primary sector. One of the priorities is to achieve sustainable agriculture proclaims in the Municipality of Guiguinto. As of 2018, 372.47 has. of rice land, 34,620 sq.m fishery, 14 has. With ornamental plants, 53 vegetable growers, and 50 livestock raisers were verified.
