Overview	A flood drill is a simulated exercise designed to
	prepare individuals and communities for a potential
	flooding event. It involves practicing the necessary
	actions and procedures to ensure safety and
	minimize damage during an actual flood. These drills

	evacuations and emergency response teams.

#### **Highlights**

Before getting started, those living in the communities within the most affected areas of the barangay met to familiarize themselves with the

routes to safe zones. Facilitators formed groups with assigned responsibilities, and the MDRRMO and BDRRMC briefed everyone on the meaning of the different sirens that would be heard during the simulation (and in a real-life emergency). One of the key purposes of drill was to bring together various factors connected to Disaster Risk Reduction, and clarify the responsibilities that would be assumed by each in an emergency. The Chairman of the BDRRMC officially started the drill, with the first warning siren (used to indicate an imminent flood) sounding at 10 am. Fifteen Minutes later, a second siren alerted the community to the water level crossing a significant threshold. The third and final siren prompted the community to evacuate via the predetermined safe routes going to the barangay hall which is classified as the temporary evacuation area of the barangay. People with disabilities, pregnant women, the elderly and those with young children were prioritized for evacuation. Those who were designated for Search & Rescue were assisted by the MDRRM Officer. Where potentially life-saving equipment would be required, the task force drilled the correct operation of these devices.





Results and Analysis,	Once the event was over, it was heartening to see
Observation	the improvements that had been made to the
	community's level of preparedness. Those
	participating in the drill knew who to turn to for help,
	and where to go. The roles assigned to the BDRRMC
	members, as well as other responders, were carried
	out swiftly and efficiently, with effective
	communication between upstream and downstream
	of the barangay
Recommendation	Conduct the drill not just to the community within
	the affected area, but also to the whole community
	of the barangay to further expand the knowledge and
	proper procedures in times of flood related incidents
Ways forward	The ways forward were to collate the learnings from
	the drill – everything that worked well, as well as that
	which could be improved – into a flood response
	plan. Created with the full participation of the flood-
	prone communities, this will ensure that best
	practice is adhered to in future.
